On Thursday, March 23, both residents and staff at Slate Valley Center on State Route 40 in Granville dressed in orange in recognition of multiple sclerosis awareness month.

Multiple sclerosis, or MS, is a disease with an unknown cause and no cure that affects the central nervous

system, causing pain, numbness and spasms. According to the Multiple Sclerosis Association of America, the average risk of developing MS in the United States is roughly 3.5 in 1,000, or less than half of one percent. According to the National Multiple Sclerosis Society from this past January, nearly

one million people in the United States are affected by MS; it's estimated that more than 2.8 million people are living with MS worldwide.

"It is so important that we recognize those who are living with this very debilitating and painful disease," said recreation director Andrea Kelley.
